- Batteries Place in the designated box at the waste collection point.
- Breakables, gas cylinders (emptied) Place in a bag or similar, marked "**Hazardous**", and leave at the waste collection point.
- Metals Place in a bag or similar, marked "Metals", and leave at the waste collection point.
- Other waste If you are not sure how to dispose of certain types of waste, contact the Accounts Subsection, Administrative Affairs (Ext.218).

Never leave these at the waste collection point!

- Needles (syringes, drip needles, acupuncture needles, etc.)
- Glass implements (test tubes, Petri dishes, ampoules, vials, etc.)
- Disposable products (tweezers, gloves, linens, etc.)

*Infectious waste is collected for disposal once a year. Store it in an infectious waste box in your laboratory, etc.

• Products containing mercury (mercury thermometers, mercury sphygmomanometers)

*Products containing mercury are collected once a year for disposal. Please store appropriately in your laboratory until the collection time.
