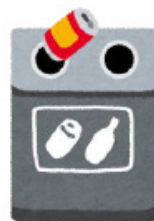


Observe the rules on waste disposal!

- PET bottles
 - Bottles
 - Cans
 - “*Moeru gomi*” (burnable waste)
- *Empty contents before discarding.
- Waste paper • Wood scraps • Food waste
 - Clothing • Rubber and leather products
 - Paper cups • Milk packs etc.
- “*Moenai gomi*” (non-burnable waste)
 - Recycling box
- Plastics • Styrofoam
 - Food trays • Pot noodle containers • CDs, floppy disks
 - Clingfilm etc.
 - Printer paper • Newspaper • Leaflets • Pamphlets
 - Magazines • Photocopy paper • Notepaper etc.
- *Cardboard should be folded and tied together with string.



- Batteries – Place in the designated box at the waste collection point.
- Breakables, gas cylinders (emptied) – Place in a bag or similar, marked “**Hazardous**”, and leave at the waste collection point.
- Metals – Place in a bag or similar, marked “Metals”, and leave at the waste collection point.
- Other waste – If you are not sure how to dispose of certain types of waste, contact the Accounts Subsection, Administrative Affairs (Ext.218).

Never leave these at the waste collection point!

- Infectious waste
- Needles (syringes, drip needles, acupuncture needles, etc.)
 - Glass implements (test tubes, Petri dishes, ampoules, vials, etc.)
 - Disposable products (tweezers, gloves, linens, etc.)
 - Sanitary materials (gauze, cotton pads, etc.)

*Infectious waste is collected for disposal once a year. Store it in an infectious waste box in your laboratory, etc.

- Products containing mercury (mercury thermometers, mercury sphygmomanometers)

*Products containing mercury are collected once a year for disposal. Please store appropriately in your laboratory until the collection time.
