Book format Submission of a main thesis (in book format) and two or more subtheses as academic papers two of which must be as first author. The two sub-theses must be academic papers published within five years retroactively from the time of the degree application.</p> <p>2. Academic paper (as first author) Submission of a main thesis in the doctoral dissertation format regulations and two or more subtheses as academic papers two of which must be as first author. The two sub-theses must be academic papers published within ten years retroactively from the time of the degree application.</p> <p>Academic paper criteria: The research topic must be related to that of the thesis to be submitted; the paper must be either in English (with an impact factor) or else published or accepted for publication (with a notification of acceptance for publication) in a peer-reviewed journal of an academic research organization cooperating with the Science Council of Japan. Those who have been enrolled in the doctoral program of TMU for at least one year, earned the prescribed credits, and completed presentations at the Research Proposal Presentation and the Interim Research Presentation in Department of Nursing Sciences shall be considered as the same as the documents submitted for the doctoral program. Research for doctoral dissertations requiring research ethics review must be approved by the Research Ethics Committee, Tokyo Metropolitan University Arakawa Campus.
